



Self-Portraits from the National Portrait Gallery February 12 - May 16, 2021

Chapman, Keeler, and O'Connor Galleries

Drawing from a collection of over 500 self-portraits, this exhibition features over 60 works that explore how American artists have chosen to portray themselves since the beginning of the last century. Created in all media, from a brick sculpture to video art, they provide a background for today's fascination with self-portraiture, and may inspire efforts to present ourselves to the world or see others with empathy and understanding.

People are confronted everyday with "selfies" through social media, and as they continue to examine the fluidity of contemporary identity this is an opportune time to reassess the significance of self-portraiture in relation to the country's history and culture.
